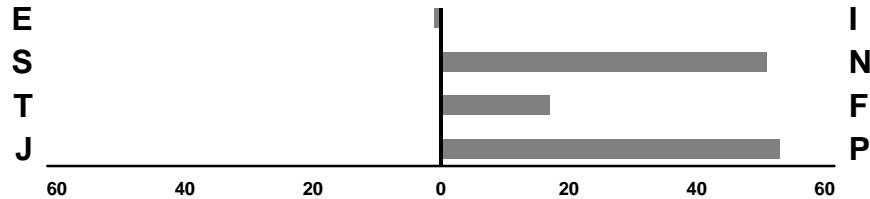

MBTI® Step II Profile for ENFP

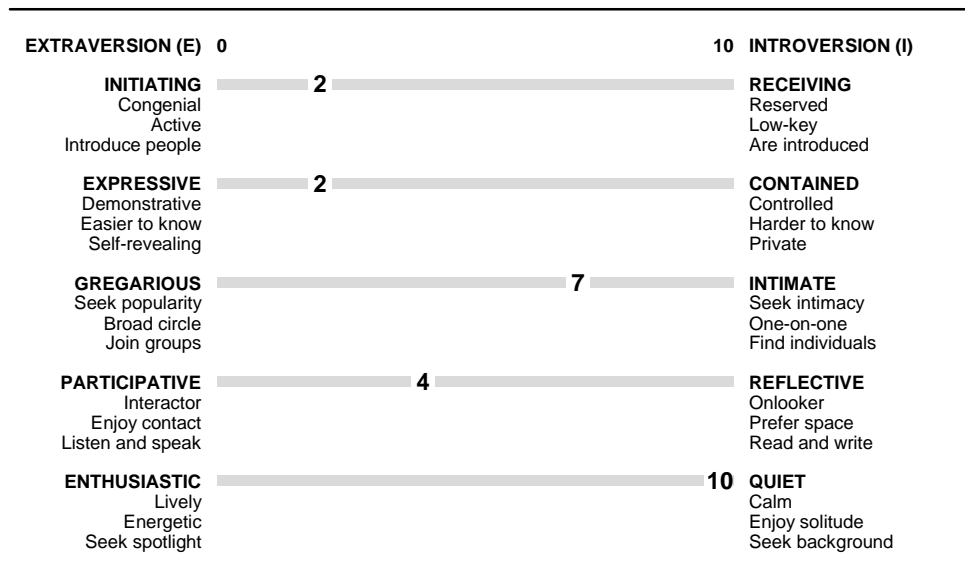

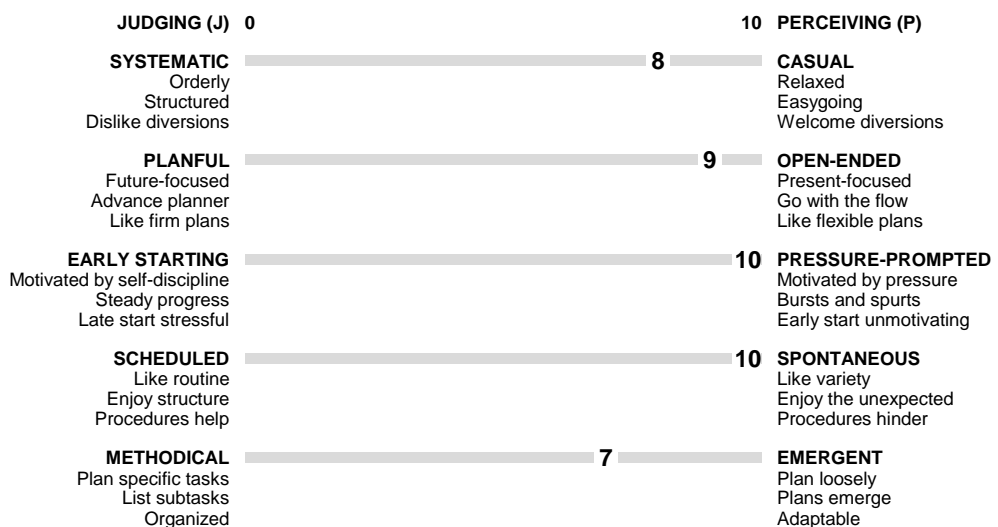
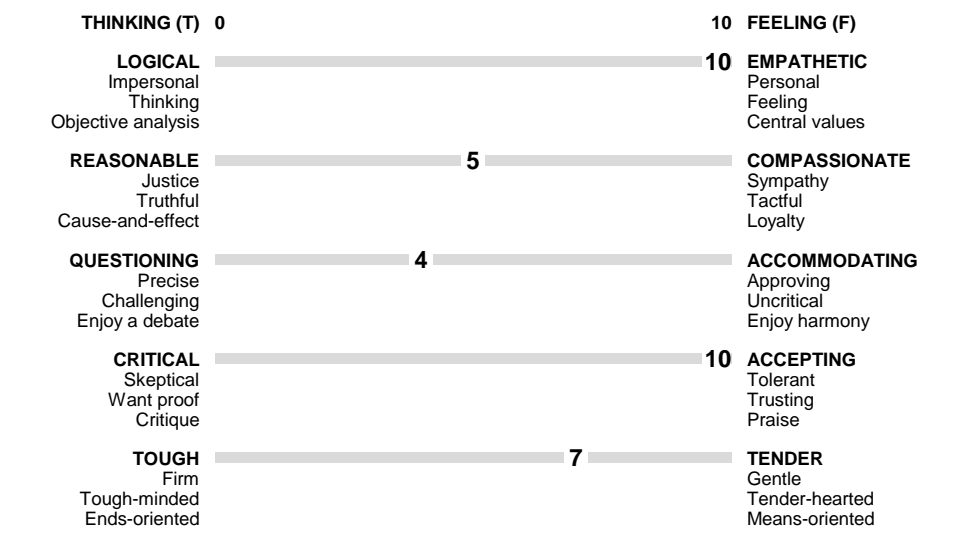
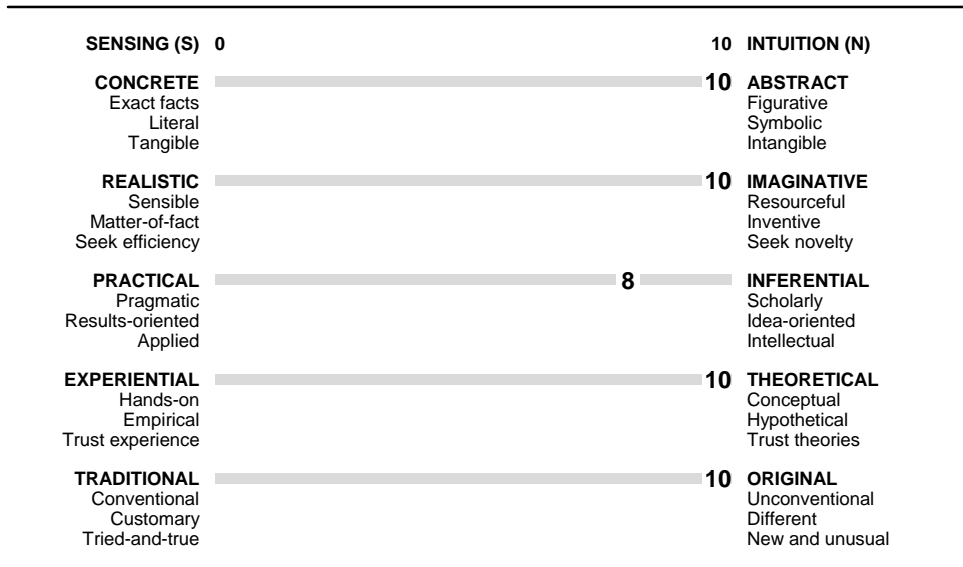
Your Subscale Results

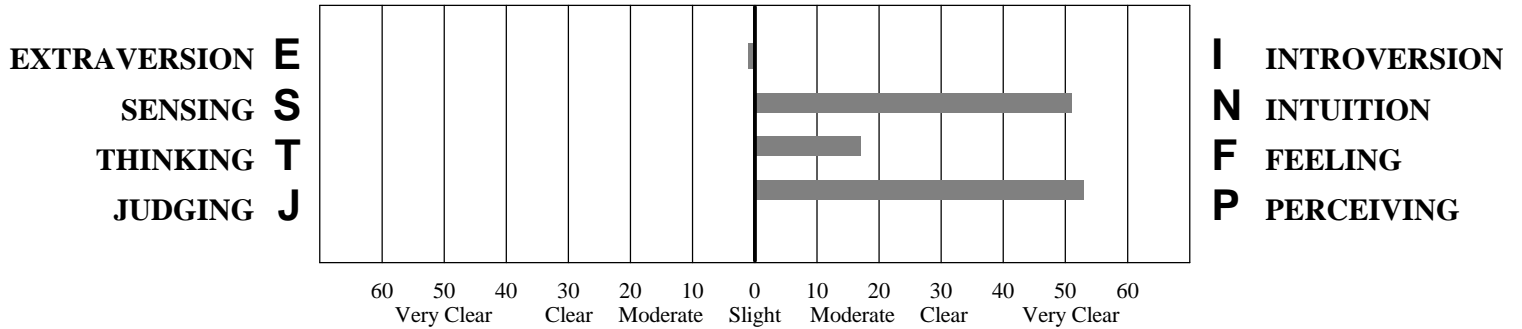

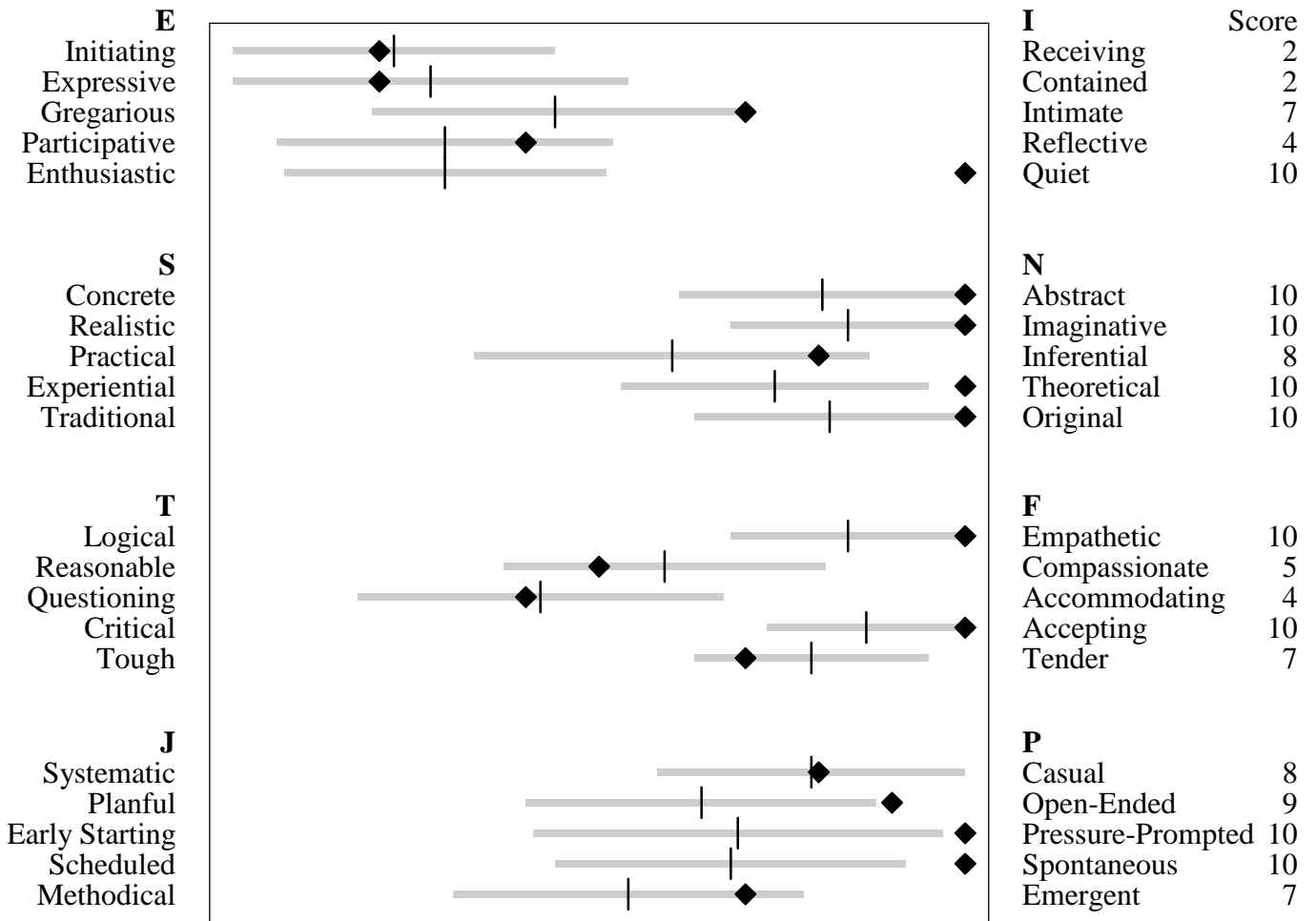
